Galloway (they/them) is the Advocacy Manager at the Ali Forney Center, where they lead local and statewide policy efforts to advance the rights, safety, and well-being of LGBTQ+ runaway and homeless youth. A proud social worker with nearly a decade of experience in direct service and systems advocacy, Galloway has worked across shelters, youth programs, and coalitions to ensure young people not only survive but thrive.

Grounded in harm reduction and abolitionist values, Galloway brings a trauma-informed, youth-centered approach to all aspects of their work. Their advocacy is shaped by a deep belief in the power of community care, mutual aid, and self-determination. They are a committed



participant in movements for transformative justice and racial equity, and they work to dismantle the systemic barriers that criminalize and marginalize queer and trans youth—particularly youth of color.

Through coalition-building, public education, legislative campaigns, and youth leadership development, Galloway continues to fight for policies and practices that center healing, dignity, and collective liberation.
